School Board News

At the end of this school year, Beeman Elementary will be saying goodbye to several longtime teachers. The New Haven School Board has regretfully accepted the retirement of Kathy Sagendorf, Dawn Thibault, Michaela Granstrom, and Denise Martin.

Kathy Sagendorf has taught 1st and 2nd grade for 25 years. Kathy is responsible for Beeman's unique Judi Smith Day and the special relationship that the school enjoys with Middlebury College. Kathy and Judi Smith taught together, and they often brought their classes to Middlebury. After Judi passed, Kathy and Judi's husband expanded the tradition to include the entire Beeman student body. It has continued for almost 20 years.

Michaela Granstrom has been Beeman's first and only Art teacher for the last 30 years. She shares her own passion and love for the arts with her students, and has always found creative and imaginative ways to integrate her lessons with other classroom learning. Michaela co-created the ANESU Fine Arts Festival, and has been the driving force behind the annual event which regularly showcases the works of over 200 students.

Dawn Thibault has co-taught in the renowned "Share Class" for 21 years. She brought her eclectic and diverse background in the arts, speech-language pathology, and mathematics to Beeman. She regularly and enthusiastically conveys her love of the sciences with children and staff alike, and coaches the Odyssey of the Mind Team. Dawn became a certified librarian while teaching at Beeman, and has always been keen to provide ample opportunities for students to write and practice literacy skills.

Denise Martin has worked with Beeman boys and girls for 28 years as an Educational Assistant and a Special Education Assistant. She is a presence everywhere in the school building, and her love and care for children has shown in every day of her long career. She will be sorely missed.

On behalf of the Beeman staff past and present, the New Haven community, and the countless students whose lives you have inspired over these decades of service, we extend our thanks and gratitude.

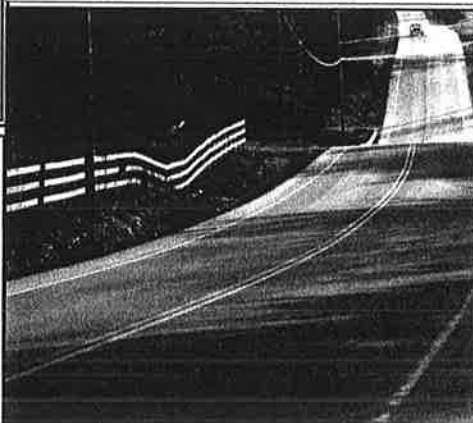
