The New Haven Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on June 1, 2016 beginning at 7:00 PM at the New Haven Town Hall in the cafeteria. This hearing is being held pursuant to 24 V.S.A. §4444. The purpose of this public hearing is to receive and address resident comments on the proposed New Haven Town Plan, dated 4/18/2016. The Town Plan affects all residents and geographic areas of New Haven. "New Haven' past and present form the foundation for our vision of our future. A Town Plan contains policies and recommendations based on that vision that are intended to guide future development in the Town". "The primary purpose of the Town Plan itself is to generally assess the Town's present condition, describe the community's desires for the future and to provide recommendations governing future changes and development ...". Community Library News. This year we are very pleased to announce that we are adding a pass to the Shelburne Museum for patrons to use. The pass allows free entrance to two adults (one of whom needs to be a library patron) and all accompanying kids, seventeen and under. Reduced rate passes are also available to state parks, historical sites, and, of course, the ever popular Echo Museum.

Last year was the first year that "Passport to Vermont Libraries" launched - very successfully. School Board News. On May 17th, all ANESU Boards convened at Mt Abraham Union High School to receive an ENDS policy monitoring report on C.1.1 Core Subjects, as well as other common topics. The report described progress and achievements including: implementation and integration of Common Core standards, enhanced programs for professional development, nimbler and more predictive local assessments, and greater personalized learning opportunities.

Positive results are being demonstrated in math test scores, both locally and across the Supervisory Union. Common Core (SBAC) test scores for ANESU 3-6 graders were generally above state averages in 2015, and this year scores are predicted to rise. In fact, 87% of Beeman 6th graders scored proficient or above on their most recent spring MAP assessment, the highest of any area elementary school.

The Act 46 Study Committee recently voted to pursue a Unified Union governance structure, similar to what is being implemented in our neighboring Supervisory Unions. In the next two months, proposed Articles of Agreement will be debated at local Board meetings with the intention of holding a community vote in conjunction with Election Day in November. We encourage community members to come to the meetings engagements on this topic, ask questions, and provide feedback.

The New Haven School Board congratulates longtime Beeman 2-3 grade teacher Robin Shalline as the recipient of the 2016 Patricia Cummings Pierce Award for Excellence. Robin is widely-regarded as one of the most talented and dedicated language arts teachers in the ANESU and beyond. She is a tireless advocate for each and every one of her students, a promoter of fresh ideas and new approaches to teaching, and a respected leader among her peers.
