The Planning Commission continues its work on drafting the Unified Bylaws, and welcomes input from the community. Meetings are held on the 2nd Monday of each month.

Development Review Board news:

The DRB held two conditional use hearings on April 18th: 1) Tamara and Joe Boise (Cyclewise); and 2) Multy Builders (Deer View Project). Cyclewise (BIYD Properties) plans to build a 67' x 122' addition to accommodate their growing business located at 130 Ethan Allen Highway. The DRB continued the conditional use hearing for the Deer View Project until June 6th at which time Multy Builders will provide an amended subdivision plat.
