TOWN OF NEW HAVEN PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE AMENDMENTS TO ZONING BYLAWS AND SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS

In accordance with 24 V.S.A. §4441 and §4444, the Town of New Haven will hold a public hearing on Monday, November 13, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. at the Town Offices, 78 North Street, New Haven. A remote option is available by logging onto:

The proposed updated and revised Zoning and Subdivision Regulations have been combined and redesigned to navigate and interpret more easily. These proposed Regulations include a step-by-step Introduction to the building application process; an Index, updated Zoning Map; a Zoning Districts Table showing density and dimensional standards applicable to land development in each of the Town's eight zoning districts; and a comprehensive Table of Allowed Uses that lists standards which apply to specified uses as allowed within one or more zoning districts. Property Tax Adjustments: We will receive the final property tax adjustment from the state on November 1st. If you have already paid your taxes and you receive an adjustment, I will send out refund checks as quickly as possible. If you believe that you qualify for an adjustment and didn't receive anything from the Town, please call the State Department of Taxes.

Next Years Taxes: In the Town of New Haven land owners pay taxes once a year, usually due around the first of October. The tax bill gets sent out months in advance, to give adequate time to pay your bill. There is no reason to be late on your taxes, simply because you forgot. Please do not wait until the last minute. There are no exceptions after your taxes go delinquent. If you can't pay your whole bill, pay what you can so you are only paying the penalties on a portion of your tax bill. We also accept payments anytime throughout the year. We do what we can to help remind taxpayers and the best thing you can do is pay as soon as you receive your bill.
