Selectboard News

The Selectboard continues to be busy this summer. We have had interviews for the road crew position, awarded the paving contracts and signed the paperwork to move forward with the Quarry Road bridge reconstruction. We continue to monitor the Vermont Gas project, giving input to minimize the visual and noise impact of the project at the gate station which is proposed to be built in New Haven. Along with the Justices of the Peace, the Selectboard will be hearing appeals of the lister's decisions on the grievance process.

The mold in the Town Hall has taken up a lot of our time. Crothers Environmental tested the mold and air quality. We had three different companies give us proposals and we hired Mountain Air, who quoted the lowest price and provided a two year warranty. After Mountain Air applied their solution, the hall had to be left for ten days before cleaning could be done. Mr. Mikes has cleaned the area and then Crothers will be back to retest. We are hopeful to have these results the first week of September. Each of these steps takes a certain amount of time and we appreciate the patience of those who had already scheduled events at the Town Hall.

As some of you know, health insurance will be changing effective January 1, 2014. We will be meeting with Bristol Insurance to learn more about our options. We will be required to purchase health insurance for our employees through Vermont Health Connect, as will many of you.

Tax Bill Information

Tax Bills were mailed on August 5, 2013. Please contact the Town offices if you have not received your bill. Check over your bill and make sure all the information is correct. If by chance there is something that needs to be corrected contact the office now as many corrections deal with the State and can be very time consuming. Please remember we do not accept post marks; allow several days for mail deliveries. You may drop off your payment in the drop box at any time. (No cash please) The office will offer extended hours the week prior to Oct. 1st.

Please do not send postdated checks. We will deposit your check when we get it. If you are worried about missing the date you can use on line bill pay to schedule your payment on a specific date. Paper work for ACH transaction is also available; this takes a while to set up and must be done ahead of time. We hate to see people become delinquent because they forgot or something happened on the day they thought they were going to pay their taxes. Please plan ahead and give yourself enough room for the unexpected.

The next time the town will receive property tax adjustment info. from the State is on Sept. 15th. We will mail corrected bills as soon as we get new or changed information from the State.

New Haven Harvest Festival

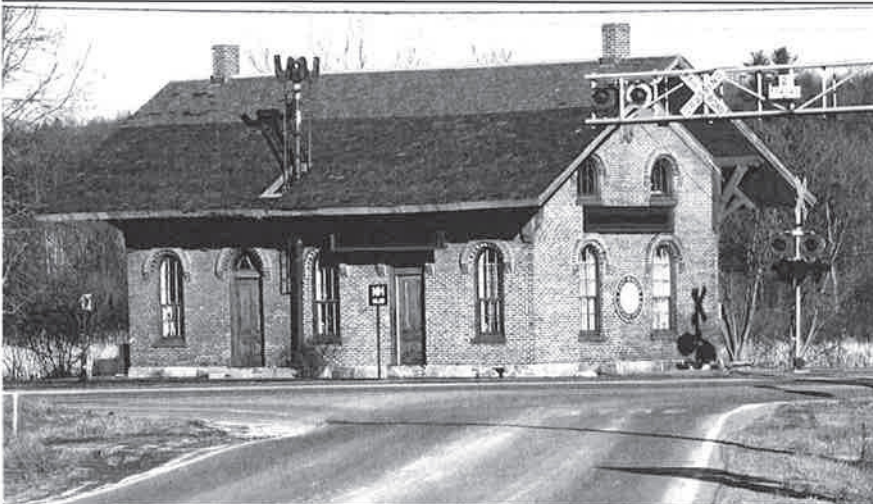
Artists, Crafters, and Vendors of all kinds wanted!
