Please do not send postdated checks. We will deposit your check when we get it. If you are worried about missing the date you can use online bill pay to schedule your payment on a specific date. (please allow enough time for the bank to process the payment)
We hate to see people become delinquent because they forgot, or something happened on the day they thought they were going to pay their taxes. Please plan ahead and give yourself enough time for the unexpected.

Every week we continue to get information from the state which will produce a revised tax bill. We mail these tax bills as soon as we receive them. The next time the town will receive property tax adjustment info from the State is on September 1st.

New Haven Community Pollinator Garden – Bee Friendly to the Pollinators

When: Sat., Sept. 17 from 10 to 11

Where: New Haven Congregational Church – 91 Town Hill Rd., across from the New Haven Green

What: Free gardening class to learn about our native pollinators (native bees, butterflies, moths, etc.) Each class, learn something fascinating about the special ways flowers and pollinators have co-evolved. Other topics: composting, storing foods from abundant harvest, starting your own pollinator-friendly garden

Why: Each of us can make a difference in reversing the declining population of native pollinators that are the keystones of our ecosystem by doing some simple things. Find out what you can do. Enjoy some seasonal snacks; take home plants or seeds for your own garden

New Haven Community Library news:

It was another great summer reading program this year, thanks to our readers. We had almost 20 participants in this year's program and they read 11,985 minutes this summer. Great job, everyone!

As part of our fall programming, the Library is collaborating with the Congregational Church and the Humanities Council to provide a series of events for the Vermont 2022 Read, "The Most Costly Journey". A fall festival is planned on October 1st from 11 am - 3 pm in honor of the contributions of the migrant workers in our community. Our celebration will include food and music from Mexico and Central America, bilingual storytime, booths from local organizations, children's crafts, first-hand sharing from migrant workers, all culminating in a community soccer game.

In addition to the festival, the Library will exhibit a portion of the "Invisible Odysseys" exhibit from the Vermont FolkLife Center between October 1st to the 13th, and a book discussion on "The Most Costly Journey" toward the end of the month. We'll be posting online and on FPF when books are available at the library as well as the date for the book discussion.

Game night will be returning to the Library on the third Wednesday of the month at 6:30 pm. Come by the Library on Wednesday, September 21st to welcome back a favorite standing program! Storytime is also making its way back over to the library and while initial plans were to begin again on Tuesdays at 10:30 am, there will be a temporary change in schedule to start. Storytime will remain on Wednesdays but at 10:30 am until October 4th. We'll move to Tuesdays at 10:30 beginning on October 11th.
