## Depot Roof Update:

We have been working on getting a list of contractors that must be approved by the Historic Preservation and the National Park Service which oversees historic buildings.

I met with three contractors on May 10<sup>th</sup> and another on May 21<sup>st</sup>. All of them seemed very interested in bidding on the project. Bids are required by June 1<sup>st</sup>.

I will be meeting with the Selectboard on June 4<sup>th</sup> to review the bids. We have been notified that after we select a bidder, it will take another 90-120 days for the Park Service to approve our bidder. I'm hoping to maybe get started this fall, but I'm an optimist.

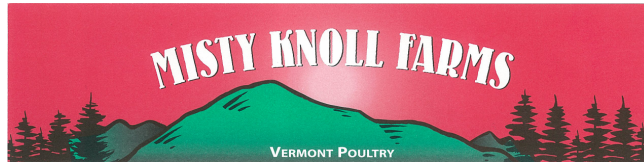
